Scholarship Dinner: Tears and Triumphs

The May 22d Homewalk Scholarship Awards dinner was festive, validating, and emotional. The room was set up so members and guests were all forward-facing. Everyone had a great view of our scholarship recipients as they were presented.

Thanks to the hard work the Zonta Club of Midland put into the Homewalk in 2011, we were able to award 9 scholarships in 2012. Each recipient told her story and validated our

purpose and solidified our resolve to continue to provide these opportunities. Some of the stories brought the audience to tears; all of the stories highlighted women of strength, determination, and an extraordinary will to succeed. Here are their stories:

Heidi Krenske is a licensed massage therapist. Her scholarship will help her become a physical therapy assistant. She is a single mother of five children and the scholarship provides much-needed financial support to help her achieve her goal.

Holly Snelenberger, a two-time scholarship recipient and this year's Dow Chemical scholarship awardee, is a divorced mother of four. It's taken 10 years, but she is in her last year at MSU working toward her Masters of Social Work degree. Holly said the support of her children saw her through the really challenging times.

Trisha Kayden is a single mother of two children, one of whom has autism. She had a career, a growing family, and thought her path was set. Then her older child was diagnosed with autism. Trisha took 10 years off to care for her child and advocate for support for autistic children and their families. She ended up on public assistance after her divorce, but all that's behind her now that she's been hired full-time and has healthcare benefits again. (continued on page 6)

The following excerpts related to our Zonta scholarships are from an article written by Melissa Barnard which will be submitted to the Midland Daily News after our celebration on June 5th.

ZONTA CLUB OF MIDLAND IS 65 AND COUNTING

On June 5, 1947 at the Midland Country Club, the Zonta Club of Midland was charted by Zonta International. The nineteen charter members were led by Mrs. Dolores Cassidy, first president of the Zonta Club of Midland and co-owner of the Frolic Theatre.

Fundraising efforts support international and local initiatives. The Zonta Club scholarship fund was started in 1951. Early fundraising activities featured the "Aura of Spring" fashion shows in the 1960's, roast beef dinners complete with homemade desserts also in the 60's, and the children's film series in the 1970's.

The popular Homewalk fundraiser has been held for 31 years. It continues to be one of the most anticipated events of the year. Since the Homewalk began, over \$200,000 has been raised to fund educational scholar-ships for women. This year nine post-secondary scholarships of \$2,000 have been awarded to qualified applicants.

It is a very Happy 65th Anniversary as the Zonta Club of Midland celebrates their past accomplishments and looks forward to continue serving and advancing women locally and globally.



A Scholarship Message from Cari Francis



Recently I stopped at Wendy's to have a quick lunch and happened to be wearing the sparkly Zonta pin I bought at Fall Conference a couple years ago. I noticed the woman sitting at the table facing me kept looking at me so I smiled at her. Then she said she noticed my Zonta pin and wondered if I was with the Midland Club. It turns out her daughter was one of the 2011 scholarship winners, Elayne Smith. I told her I had worked with her daughter at the Beaverton house for the Homewalk. She is a bright, energetic, driven young woman.

Elayne's mom shared with me how much the scholarship has meant to her daughter. She is a single mom with two daughters. Elayne's sister is in junior high and her mom shared that Elayne is her younger sister's role model. Elayne frequently tells her younger sister that she needs to work hard in school so she can go to college also.

This conversation struck me in two ways. First, we should be proud to let others know we are Zontians. Second, when we give a scholarship we are often affecting the lives of more than the recipient. Our membership just voted to fund nine scholarships at \$2000 each. That means we are directly affecting nine women's lives but it could be so many more!


Christina Curato owns the home that had the most

She thanked Judge Doreen Allen for the insistent "encouragement" she gave to Carol to return to school. Carol said her daughter, Brianna, is her inspiration and they both "go for the A." Brianna is a gymnast and just medaled in 3 out of 4 events at a recent meet. Carol is the first person in her family to have a degree. She said it's important to show children that anything is attainable if you're willing to work for it.
