Governor Quarles delivered an anniversary message comparing the status of women in 1947 society with where we are now and how Zonta impacted that status through the years. In the 1940's Zonta International became involved with the United Nations and remains one of the few non-governmental organizations to have a consultative arrangement with the UN. In Midland, the Zonta Club instigated "Work First" to help women enter the workforce and founded Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Midland County. Governor Quarles said that from those beginnings our club has evolved to enhance the status of women through our very successful Homewalk scholarship program. She closed by saying, "You've made a difference!


verbally accepted the duties and responsibilities outlined by Governor Quarles, yel-



She described how members in the early years raised money by having picnic socials and bake sales. Dinner meetings were pot roast dinners and members made the desserts. Today we're having pajama parties and giving out scholarships. Melissa said that while many things have changed over the years, two things haven't: a membership that's giving and always ready to help and the location of our meetings.
- Alisha Toyzan designed the beautiful celebration brochure. She collected members' comments regarding "What it means to be a Zontian" and narrowed the list down to the 65 reasons that made up the interior of the brochure. The graphics and elegant font made the brochure a memorable keepsake.
- Esther Seaver compiled articles, scrapbooks, memorabilia, and photos to create the display showcasing the history of our club. Included was the framed charter from 1947 that started it all.

Then, a very dynamic special guest stepped up to the podium. Mrs. Delores Cassidy (played by Randi Kawakita), the club's first president, took the microphone and regaled the audience with the story of her history and the beginning of ZCOM. With her brisk, no-nonsense manner and rapid-fire delivery, she painted a vivid picture of her life.

Trained as a nurse, she came to Midland as the wife of William Cassidy after a "whirlwind romance" and a Hollywood honeymoon. Bill, who was 23-years older than Delores, owned 5 movie theaters; one of them was the MIdland Theater on the Circle. Delores exclaimed that "the upholstery hugged you!" She helped Bill decorate the theater with commissioned bas relief artwork from Carducci. She also helped to buy bleachers for Midland High School.

Mrs. Cassidy was a professional business woman used to making her own decisions. As one of the founding members of the Zonta Club of Midland, she and 18 other members began fundraising by getting businesses to donate items for auction. Delores

loved to bake and got the Zonta Club to sponsor bake sales to raise money to help feed others.

In her closing, Delores congratulated the club on 65 years of giving and wished us a heartfelt "Happy Birthday!"

Becky encouraged everyone to stand and led the membership in singing "Happy Birthday." The birthday cake was then cut and distributed. The Archives Committee presented each member with a commemorative pen. Becky reminded everyone that the celebration of our 65th year continues throughout our Zonta year.



# Zonta Club of Midland Business Meeting Minutes - Proposed

June 5, 2012 - ZCOM's 65th Anniversary Celebration

The meeting was called to order at 12:05 pm by Cynthia Chilcote, President.

Cynthia Chilcote introduced members and guests, particularly Denise Quarles, Zonta International Governor, District 15.

Becky Wieland, Chair of the Archives Committee gave the ZCOM 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary welcome. She stated that the Zonta Club of Midland (ZCOM) has been in existence for exactly 65 years today. The charter was received at the Midland Country Club at that time. Becky declared the birthday party open. Becky also congratulated Esther Seaver for her work on the scrapbook displays at the back wall of the room which includes newspaper articles, plaques, photos of members, and other memorabilia. Becky commended Alisha Toyzan for putting together the brochure "What it means to be a Zontian" which includes 65 reasons to be a Zontian.

The anniversary message was given by the District Governor, Denise Quarles.

She told us about how the League of Women Voters in 1947 promoted human rights regardless of sex. In 1947, in some states, men controlled women's income, voting ticket and numerous other activities. The status of women has been realized since 1947. Zonta worked with the United Nations and locally in the quest for equality for women. Since the 1940's, Zonta International has been one of the few NGO organizations associated with the United Nations.

Ms. Quarles commented on the scrapbooks as an excellent record of the beginning of the ZCOM.

She also noted that in 1997, Wynette McIntyre taught women to apply for jobs and raised money for wheel-chairs and scholarships for nursing students.

ZCOM can be proud of their accomplishments and contributions to Zonta International. Grants have been awarded to such groups as the Literacy Council and the North Midland Family Center. For 35 years the annual Homewalk has provided funds for these purposes. She congratulated the Zonta Club of Midland for a job well done on behalf of Zonta International providing 65 years of service for the advancement of women and having a positive impact on the Midland community.

Cynthia Chilcote commended Becky Wieland and Melissa Barnard for their excellent job of promoting the archives, especially prior to the anniversary celebration.

Melissa Barnard gave an historical presentation about the Zonta Club of Midland with its rich history and many memories. She noted that there have been many changes from picnics, socials and pajama party; to the many different causes directed by the needs of our community and members. The Midland Country Club is still our home. The heart of our members hasn't changed - members still give of their time and talents to make our community better. As we look back at that small group of women who started the Zonta Club of Midland in 1947, we realize that they were brought together by the ZCOM and its ideals.

Randi Kawakita portrayed the character of Delores Cassidy, complete with 1940's period clothing. Delores was the first president of the Zonta Club of Midland. The president then had a two year term. There were 18 women in the first ZCOM. ZCOM met at the Country Club which was designed by Alden B. Dow. Delores Cassidy applauded our growth.

Dorothy was trained as a nurse and worked at Harper Hospital of Detroit where she met widower William Anthony Cassidy - 23 years her senior. They were married in 1939 and honeymooned in Hollywood where they met several celebrities. He died after 10 years of marriage. During that time, Delores had several pregnancies and four live births in 1941, 1944, 1946 and 1947 - three girls and one boy. She was pregnant with Billy when the ZCOM was formed. Her husband eventually had 5 theatres - two in Midland which opened in 1942. Bill commissioned Coronado Giuseppe Carducci to design the theatres. Then she went into bowling alleys. In 1959 she bought bleachers for the high school and provided a scholarship for Midland High School students to go to Alma College.

The club earned money for by having auctions. The Charter members had a bake sale in 1947 to help families provide milk for their families. "Happy Birthday!"

Delores (aka Randi Kawakita) will be at the History Center on Thursday, June 7.

Becky Wieland led the group in singing "Happy Birthday to ZCOM". Archives committee members handed out memento pens for ZCOM 65<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Becky thanked Randy for playing Delores; Michele Atwell for making the Happy Birthday Zonta cloth placemats; Alisha and Esther for designing the program; Tammy Swinson who worked with Midland Country Club to design and make the ZCOM birthday cake; and Deb Stephens for arranging the photography.

### **INSTALLATION OF 2012/2013 OFFICERS**

District Governor, Denise Quarles, installed the new officers who will be regularly attending board meetings and making decisions on behalf of the club. The board is the heart and soul of the club. Without committees the club cannot move forward. Diane Moomey lit the burgundy candle as the incoming president. Some of the board members lit the white candles from the burgundy candle to symbolize the unity of the club.

Cynthia Chilcote declined a gift as the outgoing president in lieu of giving a donation to Zonta International.

The gavel was passed from Cynthia Chilcote to Diane Moomey who was crowned president of the Zonta Club of Midland.

Sue Moody reminded us to please be supportive and to make calls to recruit Homewalk sponsors to participate in the 2012 Homewalk.

Tammy Swinson said an email will be sent out for regrets for the June 16 social meeting - the new attendance chair will send out the reminder.

A yellow rose was presented to Cynthia Chilcote for perfect attendance.

Lynda Putt, treasurer, announced that the budget was better than expected. Details can be found on her written report.

Some of the highlights were: the June social at the Voices Exhibit at historical museum; Melissa Barnard purchased a painting by the McGrath brothers and donated it to the historical society; the club members collected food pantry items – more than 400 items were donated; The Homewalk was the most successful – we were able to give nine \$2000 scholarships; some of the homeowners from the Homewalk attended the scholarship dinner; Colette was the unofficial photographer of our events; we hosted the Intercity Dinner with an Italian theme. We also had fun events like the hat contest and the spring auction. The funds from these events will support members in the training and development attendance at workshops and conferences. There were lots of other activities too numerous to mention. Cynthia closed with a thank you to members for their dedication to the ideals of the club and for giving their time and talents to Zonta.
