Lisa Grills, Executive Director of YWCA Great Lakes Bay Region in Bay City, was guest speaker at our dinner meeting on September 16th. She shared a video highlighting the mentor program that's part of the YWCA "Getting Ahead" program and the benefits it brings to participating women. Lisa, undaunted by technical difficulties which prevented her Power Point presentation, spoke passionately about the focus and mission of YWCA

YWCA advocates for the advancement of women and families and offers programs that support that mission. Some of the areas they address are community education, parenting, and mentoring. Lisa explained that the "Getting Ahead" program is "a long term solution, not a band-aid." Women commit to a 13-week curriculum, which is based on Dr. Ruby Payne's "Bridges out of Poverty" program. This program gives women who have low self-esteem, no motivation, poor education and learning habits, an opportunity to improve their situation.

The YWCA Great Lakes Bay Region is updating the "Economic Status of Women in the Great Lakes Bay Region" study published a couple of years ago. The poverty supplement will be uploaded in the next few weeks. Lisa reported that women-led single-parent households are four times more likely to live in poverty and that the Great Lakes Bay Region has a higher percentage than the state average.

Another advocacy program YWCA is developing is a partnership with SVSU for a Political Leadership Initiative to launch in 2015. Lisa explained that it's purpose is to encourage and empower women's interest and participation in the political system. In addition, a new Economic Status report will be published in 2016; it keeps YWCA focused on empowering women economically.

How can Zonta help? Lisa suggested that Zonta members can lend support through donations to the endowment fund, volunteering as a mentor, recruiting for programs, and participating in committee work or as a board member. Future plans have YWCA programs opening in Midland.

In closing, Lisa reminded everyone of the Women's Empowerment Symposium at the Great Hall in Midland on November 17th. Four guest speakers will address empowerment, education, and personal and professional

Hello Zonta Members,

As Fall is upon us, we are well into our Zonta year. At September's business meeting, we shared the goals the board has set for the 2014-2015 year:

We plan to highlight the Zonta Foundation service projects and local service projects in brief presentations at our lunch meetings. In addition, we want to make sure you have time to connect and network with your fellow Zontians at our meetings and at "Zings" that will be planned throughout the year.

I wanted to make sure you are all aware that the board has approved covering the entire cost of registration for the Fall District Workshop. Please consider coming to Gaylord for a wonderful time of learning more about Zonta, hearing fabulous speakers, and fellowshipping with Zontians from around our district.

As we head into the busy time of year for Homewalk, please join me in extending a hearty thanks to our Homewalk Committee for their diligent work. Having chaired Homewalk in the past, I can appreciate the number of hours and work this committee is putting into planning our club's annual fundraiser.



A. 10-12 women per class; there will be 2 classes initially, with a 3 added as needed.

Q. Does Bay City YWCA serve just the Bay City area?

A. No, anyone who walks in is served.

Q. Where will the Getting Ahead program beheld in Midland?

A. Windover High School.

Q. How are women selected for participation in the program?

A. A one-on-one assessment is done because not everyone meets the criteria.

Q. How do you measure success of the program?

A. Some of the success measures include: continued employment or education; adequate housing acquired; 70% retention; 60% go on to meet employment or education goal.


