This is an exciting time of year for our club. We get to enjoy empowering women and girls in our community and around the world thanks to the hard work we all did on Homewalk.

With our Service Committee grants, we help women and girls served by organizations throughout our community. We do this because of the monies raised through Homewalk ticket sales. The Service Committee, under the leadership of Jill Vander Zouwen, has been hard at work looking at and evaluating service grant requests. At our March business meeting, you'll get to hear about the great projects that have requested support.

In addition, women are currently applying for Zonta scholarships thanks to the monies raised through Homewalk sponsorships. We hope to award 12 scholarships of \$2000

each to women from our community who are continuing their education and pursuing career goals that will positively impact the status of women. The scholarships are for women re-entering the workforce or who are in the workforce going back to school. Those entering college/vocational certification directly from high school will be considered as well. We will have the pleasure of meeting our scholarship award winners at our May dinner meeting.

The final way we are helping our sisters around the world is through the work of Zonta International Foundation. Since 1994:

- Zontians have given almost \$31 million to help women globally,
- Over two million women's lives have changed in 57 countries because of Zonta, and
- Over \$10 million has been spent on women's education.

You'll get to hear more at our March lunch meeting and our May dinner meeting (and meetings in between too).

Girl Scouts Donate to Our Auction

It's become a tradition at our annual auction that we have a table stacked with Girl Scout cookies. The boxes are numbered and peoples pay for as many boxes as they'd like in the hopes that their number will be drawn for a fabulous prize. This activity has added \$500 dollars to our auction night proceeds.

Where do these cookies come from and how do we get them? This year Lynda Putt's niece is our cookie connection. She's a member of Girl Scout Troop 50917 and they donated 50 boxes of cookies to our April auction. There are people who purchase cookies to support the Girl Scouts, but they really don't want the actual cookies, so they donate them back to the troop. The troop then finds a good cause to donate the cookies to.

Four 1st graders from the troop with their leader came to the Ways and Means Committee meeting to drop off the cookies. The committee shared information about Zonta and how the money raised from the auction cookie sale will be used. In turn, the first grade scouts, or Daisies, told the committee about Girl Scouts. They asked questions like, "What is a scholarship?" and "What is a community?"

"These young girls are learning at a very early age about service to others through their service projects," said Lynda. During the holiday season, they sang Christmas carols at an assisted living facility. With proceeds from cookie sales, the girls are purchasing diapers and donating them to the Diaper Alliance. They will help organize and repackage diapers for distribution.

Note that applicants from geographic areas within a Zonta district/region where no clubs are located will be considered and also eligible to apply for the district/region Award. Z and Golden Z club members are also eligible to apply.

- Active commitment to volunteerism
- Experience in local or student government, workplace leadership (paid or unpaid)
- Volunteer leadership achievements
- Knowledge of Zonta International & its programs Advocating for Zonta International's mission to advance the status of women worldwide

CLUB:

One applicant from each club recommended for district/region Award.

DISTRICT:

One recipient per district/ region receives district/region Award of US\$1,000 and application is submitted to be considered for an International Award.

international:

Ten district/region Award recipients receive an additional US\$4,000 International Award.

- The custom of bumping glasses with a "cheers" greeting came from old Rome where they used this method to make sure no one is trying to poison the other (bumping glasses makes the drink spill from one cup to the other). This tradition started even earlier in ancient Greece-where the host was to drink the first cup of wine to show his guests he does not intend to poison them
- During prohibition, grape juice mix was sold with the warning "After dissolving the brick in a gallon of water, do not place the liquid in a jug away in the cupboard for twenty days, because then it would turn into wine."
- If you own a collection of bottles don't keep them standing up this can cause the cork to dry, shrink and oxygen/air might get in the bottle. Always keep the bottles lying down (unless it's an artificial cork.)
