The beauty of a yellow rose has been a favorite Zonta symbol for over thirty years. The Zonta Rose was introduced at the 1984 Sydney Convention, as a living

symbol of Zonta International. Since 1999, the Zonta Rose has serviced as a symbol of Zonta Rose day on March 8, the same day as the International Women's Day. The Zonta Rose is used as a symbol of friendship. The Zonta Rose is registered internationally and also is known as Bright Lites in the United States.

Scholarships and Grants to be awarded, \$20,000 in total



From the Desk of Denise Sylvester, Advocacy Chair

On January 21, women and men went to Washington, DC to inform our leaders just how important women's rights and equal rights are. Women still earn less than men; there is a lot of work to do to ensure gender equality. For those near Lansing, they were able to join the sister event to the Women's March on Washington, to the steps of the State Capitol in Lansing.



As a reminder Zonta is non-political and non-partisan so we urge you to stop participating in Zonta's name if any events/marches you are attending turns political.

At the Governor's Summit, clubs were given resources on interacting with their elected officials. Now more than ever is the time to contact your electedrepresentatives and tell them where you stand on issues impacting women and girls. The Michigan Attorney General's office has declared Wednesday, January 11th as National Human Trafficking Awareness Day, part of National HumanTrafficking Awareness and Prevention Month. Why is this important? Three trafficking bills recently became law on December 23, 2016 and will become effective on March 14, 2017. The bills are Public Act 336, Public Act 337, and Public Act 338, calling for longer prison sentences of convicted traffickers, addressing victim reimbursement and witness immunity, and allowing victims of trafficking to expunge certain past crimes from their record. The fight to end human trafficking is along one, and protecting victims versus treating them like criminals is onestep in the right direction.

14,400 - 17,500: estimated number of people trafficked into the U.S. each year.

50% of people trafficked into the U.S. each year are children.

800,000 people are trafficked worldwide each year.

AMELIA EARHART FELLOWSHIP

According to Women in Aerospace, in 2010, roughly 10 percent of the aerospace industry was made up of women. While the number has slowly increased, there must be reinforcements behind each step forward. To assist the future of women in this field and other aerospace-related sciences and engineering, Zonta International established the Amelia Earhart Fellowship in 1938 in honor of legendary pilot and Zontian, Amelia Earhart.

Since the program's inception, Zonta International has awarded 1,508 Amelia Earhart Fellowships, totaling more than \$9.3 million, to 1,079 women from 70 countries. Today, the Fellowship of \$10,000 is awarded annually to 35 talented women, pursuing Ph.D./doctoral degrees in aerospace-related sciences or aerospace-related engineering around the globe. In 2016, three of the 35 AE Fellows, proposed school was University of Michigan!
