Friday Night Fun night showing of Little Stones Documentary with Skype from Sophia Kruz

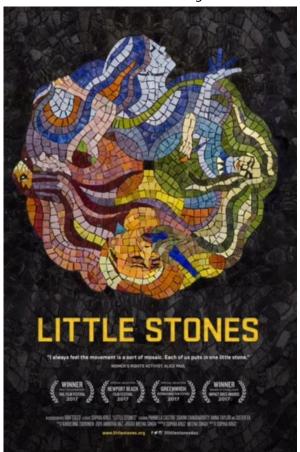
Sophia Kruz is an EMMY Award-winning documentary filmmaker and TEDx speaker. Her work has been broadcast nationally and screened at film festivals and museums around the world. Her most recent film, Little Stones, won Best Documentary at the Vail Film Festival, Best Foreign Documentary at the Female Eye Film Festival, and an Award of Excellence from Impact Docs.

Previously, Kruz produced Ride the Tiger, a nationally-broadcast PBS documentary about neuroscience and bipolar disorder. She also produced, directed, and edited the EMMY Awardwinning film A Space For Music, A Seat For Everyone.

In 2015, Kruz co-founded Driftseed, a nonprofit which seeks to empower women and girls in the U.S. and around the world through the art of documentary storytelling. Kruz was the recipient of

the 2015-2016 University of Michigan Center for the Education of Women Visiting Social Activist fellowship, and her documentary work has been supported by the National Endowment for the Arts, Michigan Council for Arts & Cultural Affairs, Womanity Foundation, and many others.

Little Stones is an award-winning documentary that unites the personal narratives of four women around the world using art to create positive change in their communities. From a graffiti artist speaking out against domestic violence in the favelas of Brazil to a dancer rehabilitating sex-trafficking survivors in India, each of these women is contributing a stone to the mosaic of the women's movement

through their art.

Sunday Keynote, Elizabeth McCormick

A decorated US Army Black Hawk pilot, Elizabeth flew command and control, air assault, top-secret intelligence missions and also transported high-level government VIPs. Now, Elizabeth keeps attendees on the edges of their seats, turning her experiences into lessons that any audience can implement into immediate action.

Elizabeth's many military awards include the Meritorious Service Medal. In 2011 Elizabeth received the US Congressional Veteran Commendation for her service to her country and community as a disabled veteran.

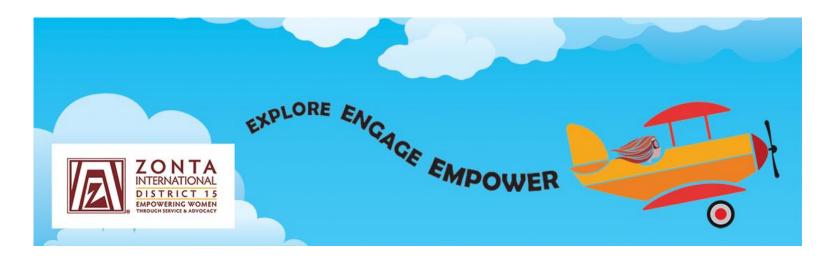

District Service Project

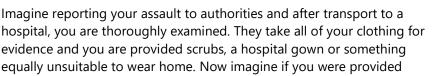
2016-2018 biennium effort, assisting victims of sexual violence

We are excited to announce the Zonta District Service Project for the 2016-2018 biennium. In keeping with the theme to empower women and girls and

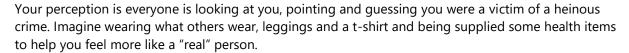

Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE)

Shelterhouse offers a <u>community-based SANE program</u> that includes specially trained nurses and Shelterhouse advocates. This team serves victims in a confidential and compassionate manner, while improving evidence collection for more comprehensive investigations. The SANE program is free of charge and provides services to victims of all ages. The community-based SANE program is run through the Council on

Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault (Shelterhouse) and operates in a donated space at the Center for Women's Health. Specially trained SANE nurses provide medical care and forensic evidence collection and Shelterhouse advocates provide emotional support.



ZCOM scholarship awarded to Rau

The Zonta Club of Midland awarded a \$500 Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship to Dallas Rau. Rau's scholarship application has been forwarded to the Zonta district level to compete for the international scholarship award.

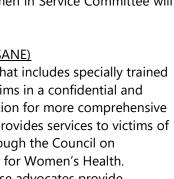
Rau is a junior at Northwood University, working towards her degree in

International News





This is the second year since the development of the Sustainable Development Goals by the United Nations. The Under-Secretary-General for Economic and Social Affairs, Mr. Wu said he was "struck" by how far countries have come towards reaching the development goals, and how far they still have to go.

For example, over 767 million people worldwide live on less than \$1.90 per day in 2013, despite nearly one billion people escaping poverty since 1999. The maternal mortality ratio must more than double the current progress by 2030; women's political participation must climb some 75 percent to reach equality with men, and more efforts must be put into preventing and treating non-communicable diseases so people do not die prematurely.

The key to realizing sustainable development "by all people and for all people" is revitalizing and enhancing global partnerships, the senior UN official said, calling for all relevant people to come together and work together, and to mobilize the necessary resources to put their ideas into practice.
