

### **ZCOM Supports Local Service Projects in 2016**





The Service Committee, chaired by Jill VanderZouwen, has been hard at work soliciting and evaluating proposals from local organizations for funding by Zonta in 2016. Grants totaling \$7000 were awarded:

Caregiving Network - \$900 for the purchase of feminine care and personal hygiene products for women (not attainable with Bridge Cards) as part of their food pantry

**Legacy Center for Community Success** - \$900 to assist female low income, low-literacy learners improve their WorkKeys scores and qualify for job training programs

**Young Lives** - \$1000 for meals at weekly club meetings, club supplies, camp expenses and gas money in support of one-on-one mentoring to assist girls in gaining confidence, improving parenting skills, gaining education and increasing independence in obtaining jobs and housing

**ARC of** Midland - \$600 to help three women with intellectual and developmental disabilities start micro-enterprises

**West Midland Family Center** - \$800 to provide personal growth opportunities for 2-3 female participants in the Dow College Opportunity Program; activities help students gain confidence, explore options, gain skills and become fully engaged in their intended fields of study



**Girls on the Run** - \$1000 for snacks and new running shoes for girls learning about self-image, physical and emotional health, healthy lifestyles, healthy relationships and community involvement

**Midland County Former Offenders Advocacy and Rehab** - \$900 to help provide employment/housing services transportation, programs and targeted assistance (driver's license fees, resume preparation, job coaching) for 74 female clients

- 5. How will it give Zonta visibility in the community?
- 6. Is the project sustainable?
- 7. Is there an opportunity for collaboration with other organizations? Which ones?

# D15 Service Projects Advance to Next Round

Thank you to all those clubs sending nominations for the District 15 Service Recognition Awards. The service work by clubs in our district is varied and invaluable to our respective communities. The District is so proud of the great work everyone does in the name of service.

A district committee can select up to 3 club projects to send on to Zonta International for consideration for the Zonta International Service Recognition Awards.

### Advocating for Global Change

Education and Sensitization – Women and Ebola



### UN WOMEN CONFRONT EBOLA VIRUS

Since the Ebola outbreak in West Africa was declared an international public health emergency, many UN organizations have been working hand-in-hand to help those affected on the ground. UN Women has been facilitating mobilization and information efforts targeting women, who have been disproportionately affected by this disease (exposure of women is greater because of their traditional caregiving roles), coordinating UN efforts to address gender within the response, and supporting the collection of sex-disaggregated data.

To help curb the spread of Ebola and mitigate its impacts, UN Women has focused on supporting sensitization and advocacy on Ebola and its gender dimensions primarily in Liberia and Sierra Leone. Programs in Liberia and Sierra Leone include: working with local radio stations and with traditional leaders to raise awareness and aid prevention; producing educational materials to train health workers; supporting orphaned children and stigmatized survivors; ensuring that women's needs are reflected in all aspects of the UN's humanitarian response; providing economic grants for hard-hit cross-border traders; and more.



# Liberia Mobile Banking Help Ebola-impacted Women Traders

Since the Ebola outbreak began, prevention measures while addressing health concerns, have taken a drastic toll on the livelihoods and economic security of women traders in Liberia. In a country where approximately 85 per cent of daily market traders are women, closed markets and travel restrictions are causing a significant drop in sales. As a result, many are defaulting on repayment of the loans they used to invest in various businesses. To address the issue, UN Women and the Central Bank of Liberia have partnered to provide some 2,500 women cross-border traders with cash transfers via mobile technology, in order to help them save and expand their businesses.

#### Sierra Leone

#### Restoring Confidence in Health Facilities in Sierra Leone

On the last leg of her three-day visit to Sierra Leone on 24 March, UN Women Executive Director Phumzile Mlambo-Ngcuka launched the UN Women-supported Mano River Union First Ladies Initiative on Maternal and Reproductive Health Services at the Kenema District Government Hospital. The project aims to put essential services back on track and restore eroded confidence in health services.
